# NATIONAL STANDARDS FOR PERSONAL FINANCIAL EDUCATION

The National Standards for Personal Financial Education, which are published by the Jump\$tart Coalition and the Council for Economic Education, provide a framework for teaching personal finance in kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade, and contain areas of knowledge and understanding that are fundamental to personal finance. Standards are published at the 4<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup> grade levels; the table below shows alignment between Money Smart for Young People and the 12<sup>th</sup> grade standards.
